**Re: Year 11 Pre Public Exams 2 (PPE2)**

Please be advised that the Year 11 PPE2s begin on **Monday 4 March** and will last until **Friday 15 March** inclusive. These exams provide crucial information about how your child is likely to perform in the GCSE exams in the summer.

A copy of the PPE2 timetable is attached. It will also be displayed in tutor rooms, on the Year 11 noticeboard in the auditorium, given to students in hard copy and will be available on the school website. The examinations will test the students on aspects of the work covered since the start of Year 10.

Individual departments/teachers will provide students with the necessary guidance and resources to prepare for these examinations, all of which will be available on Show My Homework (SMHW). Parents have access to SMHW, so please ask the office ([office@esherhigh.surrey.sch.uk](mailto:office@esherhigh.surrey.sch.uk)) if you don't know your username or password. Information about how to support your child to revise was also given at the recent Year 11 Parent Workshops. Students have been given a copy of the 40-10 revision planner to complete and use.

These exams will be carried out following the JCQ rules and regulations, which are printed on the reverse of the timetables given to the students, but to summarise the key points:

- Students should arrive at least 10 minutes before the start of each exam and line up outside the venue silently.
- Students should bring all equipment needed for exams in a clear plastic pencil case including black pens, pencils, ruler and other mathematical equipment/calculator (for Maths and Science exams).
- Students should not bring anything into the exam venue to cheat and must not communicate in any way with other students or disturb others in any way.
- No mobile phones/watches/electronic devices are allowed with the student during any exams. Students will be asked to deposit their phones in a box prior to the start of each exam and this will be securely stored in another room. Please advise your child not to bring their phone to school if you are unhappy with this process.
- Please inform the school as usual if your child is ill on an exam day and we will arrange with their teacher to re-sit any exams missed at a later date.

These examinations are very important and I ask you to ensure that your child uses the time between now and the beginning of March to revise thoroughly. Students will be issued with a copy of their **GCSE Public Exams timetable, a revision countdown calendar and another 40-10 revision planner just before the half term break.**
