This is an opportunity to discover the Hubs and ask any questions about what County Care's Community Skills Project is all about, particularly for those individuals that may be transitioning into adulthood from their education placement?

The Hubs are geared towards employment, learning life skills and gaining independence at home and in the community. At Community Skills Project, individuals experience a wide variety of groups and activities to help with the next stages of life. Some of these groups include:

- "Project Pathways" -focused on getting individuals into paid work and volunteering placements.
- "Plan It Buy It cook It Group" -focused on cooking and budgeting skills.
- "Project Cafe" - community cafes open to the public where individuals do everything from serving, food preparation to taking payments.
- "Project Radio" - a live radio station from the hub's purpose-built studios.
- "Project Enterprise" -individuals make amazing creations, help with marketing and then sell them at events to the public.
- "Horticulture" – the Hubs have gardens/allotments which individuals manage and use the produce in the cafes.
- "Woodwork Project" -teaching valuable skills with woodwork professionals.
- "Travel Training"- learning how to use public transport independently.
- "Healthy Lifestyles" -engaging in various sporting and mindfulness activities from swimming to yoga.

The service they offer is very flexible and person-centred to meet the individual's needs. It's also a great social opportunity to make new friends and have an independent life away from family. County Care also provide support for many evening social activities, trip outings and outreach support in service users' homes and local communities.

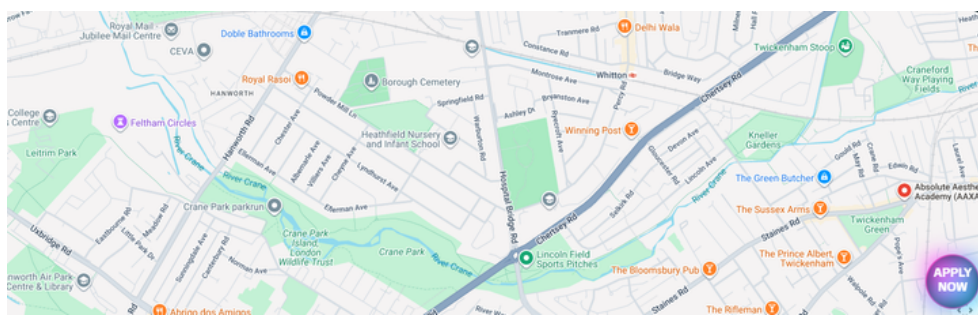

The Future Skills Programme: Careers in STEM

The Future Skills Programme: Careers in STEM is a comprehensive experience delivered virtually in February and May half term. Students can explore STEM careers in four key pathways and see how they can develop and document their skills for both successful applications and how to succeed in the workplace.

THE COURSE WILL INCLUDE A SERIES OF LIVE SESSIONS::

- Live Q&A sessions with STEM professionals in four key STEM areas Net Zero futures, Digital AI futures, Health and Life Sciences futures and Engineering, Infrastructure and Manufacturing futures.
- A session with early careers professionals on how to make successful applications including how to showcase their skills on their CV, applications and interviews.
- Hear from apprentices and universities about opportunities available in STEM in interactive panel Q&A sessions.
- A session with early careers professionals on how to succeed in the workplace including how to ask questions, networking and writing professional emails.

At the end of the scheme, students will develop their own action plan for how they can succeed in a STEM career.

Students will graduate as Bronze-level Industrial Cadets, a nationally recognised award that students can use as evidence of their experience and take forward to complement their future applications and career journeys.

Course requirements

- Open to all students in year 9 and 10 / S3 and S4 and suitable for all abilities.
- All students need is a genuine interest in STEM careers and inquisitiveness about what the future can hold for them and how they can help get themselves there.

Course structure

20 hours of study to complete flexibly over 5 days during February or May half term.

The course is available on 16th – 21st February 2026 and 26th–29th May 2026.
